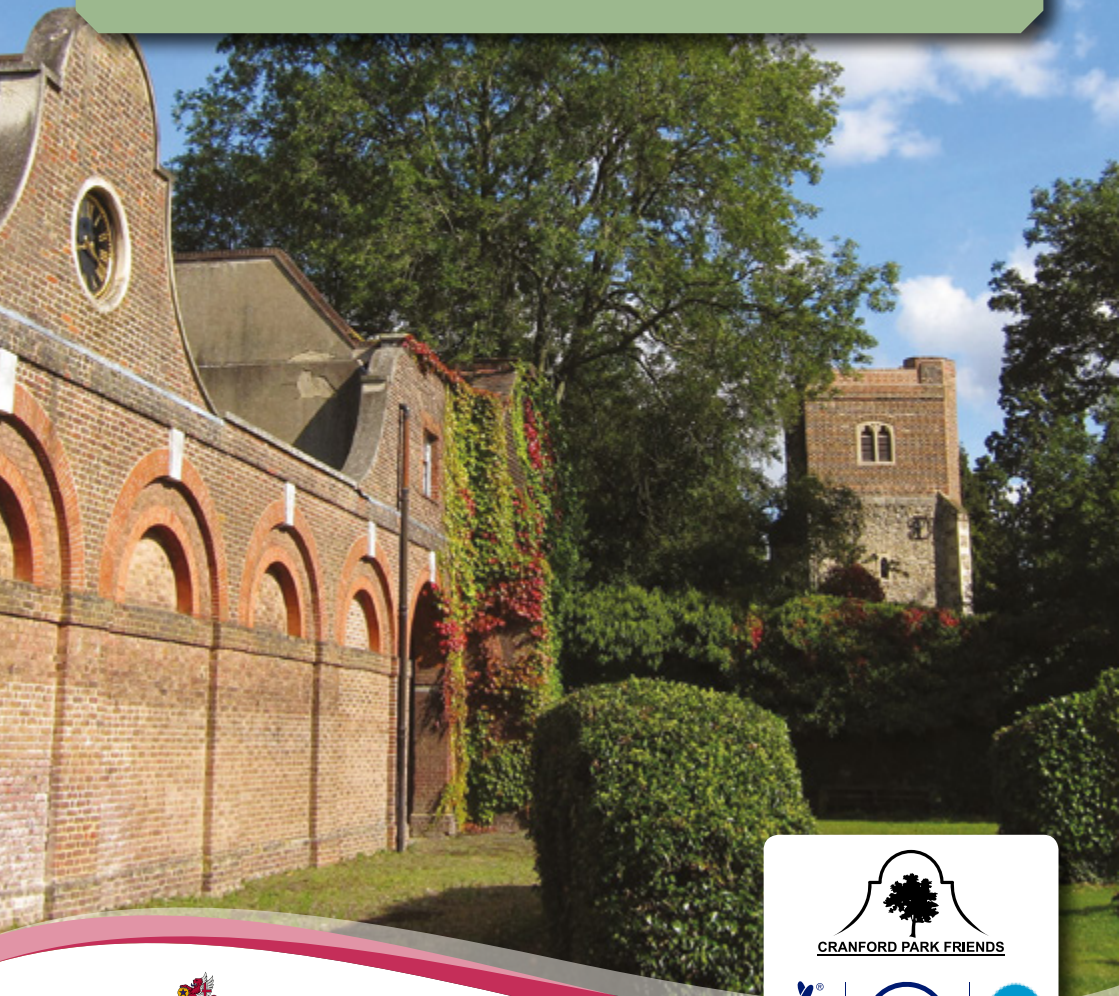


Discover Cranford Park

This beautiful public open space, with woodland, riverside walks, gardens, orchard, meadows and historic stable yard, was all once part of Cranford House grounds, which was for 300 years the country home of the Earls of Berkeley. The historic driveway, with a bridge over the River Crane, joins the A312 at the M4 roundabout.

...repair the historic stables, still with their stalls and mangers, where the Berkeley's horses were kept.



...open up the 17th-century vaulted brick cellars under the former house, unseen since the Berkeley's servants worked there.



...rebuild a demolished wing of the stables to house a café, toilets and meeting room.



...create new volunteering opportunities: so you can join an archaeological dig, learn how to maintain an orchard or plant fruit bushes in the walled garden, help improve the river which will increase the wildlife in and around it, and help create a new wetland area.



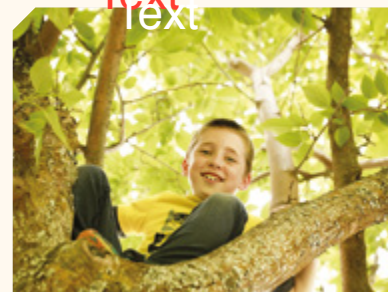
...restore the gardens and historic features such as the high garden walls, ice house and ha-ha.

...improve cycling and running routes.

Getting to Cranford Park

On foot or by bicycle: Via St. Dunstan's subway from Roseville Road, the subway from Fuller Way or the footpaths from Cranford Lane, Church Road or Watersplash Lane.

By bus: Routes 195 (North Hyde Road) and E6 (nearest to the Roseville Road subway).

By train: Hayes & Harlington station, 1km to the north west.

By car: Turn off The Parkway (A312) immediately before the west-bound slip road off the M4 roundabout at Junction 3.
